Protecting Biodiversity in Bologna Area

Preserving the balance

Welcome to our hotel, located in a province rich in nature and culture. The province of Bologna (now part of the Metropolitan City of Bologna) is characterized by a remarkable landscape diversity, covering approximately 3,700 km² and comprising three main geographical zones: plains, hills, and mountains. This morphological diversity makes the area particularly interesting from a naturalistic, agricultural, and urban planning perspective. We invite you to discover the natural wonders of Bologna and its surroundings and join us in protecting them.

Why is biodiversity essential?

Biodiversity supports ecological balance and ensures essential natural services, such as water and air purification.

Natural Environments

Plains and agricultural areas:

The Bologna plain is home to cultivated fields, hedgerows, and small woods, which serve as habitats for many species. Water bodies, such as canals and man-made ponds, attract amphibians and waterfowl such as ducks, herons, and egrets.

Bolognese hills:

The hills are characterised by mixed forests of oak, hornbeam, and chestnut trees.

The clearings and hilly meadows are rich in wildflowers, including spontaneous orchids, and are home to pollinating insects such as bees and butterflies.

River areas:

The Reno and Savena rivers are vital ecological corridors for many species. Their banks are populated by willows, poplars, and fauna such as kingfishers, otters, and various fish species.

Flora and Fauna

Bologna boasts a diverse flora, including typical species of the plains, such as the black poplar and the alder, and hillside plants such as the juniper and the downy oak. In the wildest areas, you can find spontaneous aromatic plants such as thyme and lavender.

Mammals: Foxes, porcupines, badgers, roe deer and wild boars are common in the woods and hills.

Birds: The city and its surroundings are home to species such as the kestrel, the barn owl and the great spotted woodpecker.

Reptiles and amphibians: Newts and frogs live in the waterways, while lizards and non-venomous snakes, such as the grass snake, populate the hills.

Insects: Biodiversity includes butterflies such as the swallowtail and a wide variety of bees, which are essential for pollination.





Protected Areas

Bologna has invested in protecting biodiversity through numerous nature reserves and parks, such as the Parco dei Gessi e Calanchi dell'Abbadessa, the Parco del Monte Sole, and the Parco della Chiusa.
